ROBERTS' RAMBLE

I usually see something that inspires me when I write these columns, or someone talks about something that sparks my interest. This time is was the delightful days of sunny, warm weather we have been enjoying. Spring is a time when we look forward to the joys of summer, the arrival of our celebration of the birth of Christ and the hope of a good and well-deserved holiday. It also reminds me of the early morning starts in the south westerly gales of the South Wairarapa on the lambing beat. And the joy of helping another little creature into the world. Both are causes for wonder and joy. They are causes for thanksgiving. A spiritual author reminded me that our daily prayer should always include thanks for all God's mercies to us. It is relatively easy to remember the big causes for giving thanks; less easy to remember the wonderful little things that happen to us. I'm thinking of the smile someone gave me this morning as I arrived for coffee, the cheery good morning I received when I arrived at the Office for our weekly meeting. The chat I had with a shop assistant when I collected repaired clothes. Also the listening heart when I had a little grumble. I know they are tiny things but they make up the warp and woof of daily life. As I think of them I hope that I returned them with interest. These are the little things of christian community life. They are the glue that holds us together and remind us of the love our Triune God has for us.. And, importantly they, and many other things, are a reflection of the divine love we share with others around us. I thought too that we should not only give thanks for the beauty of creation but always ensure that this thanksgiving is accompanied by care for God's creation placed in our charge. I made the point at Mass on Wednesday that each of us is like the little candle we carry into the darkened Church at the Paschal (Easter Vigil). As I stand before the Altar for the final repetition of "Christ our Light" I see all the little lights coalescing together making great light which warms us during the Paschal Praeconium (the great Easter song of thanksgiving). Sometimes I think of the "light" we bear into the world and, like moths attracted to the light, others being welcomed into the Light of Christ. And for this, too, I give great thanks to God, for I see his people about the work Christ left us. Keep me in your prayers as I keep you and your

families in mine. Father John.


