Lenten Programmes



The Spirit drove Jesus out into the wilderness and he remained there for forty days, and was tempted by Satan. He was with the wild beasts, and the angels looked after him. Mark 1.12

The fact that you are reading this means you are on the road, on the journey we call Lent, in preparation to celebrate the great Christian feast of Easter. In this Sunday's gospel we're told Jesus was *driven out into the wilderness* where he was tempted by the evil one. On occasion, we may find ourselves driven out into the desert by illness or misfortune, or any number of situations beyond our control. In these 40 days of Lent, we are invited to voluntarily go into the desert to spend some time with our Lord, freeing ourselves as much as we can from the usual cares of life.

In earlier times Lent was seen primarily as a time of severe penance - a way of purifying ourselves from our sinful habits. Even though we are no longer asked by the Church to observe the severe penances of former times, it is very appropriate that we make some of form of preparation. Lent is a gift, it's a great time for personal reflection on where we stand as Christians. Only a little reflection will show us that, there are times when we fail to be the kind of people that the Gospel challenges us to be.

What kind of a person am I in relation to my family, friends, working colleagues and other people I

come in contact with? How active am I as a member of my Christian community e.g. my parish? What difference do I make to other people's lives? How is my prayer life? Is prayer a regular part of my day? What do I do, within my limitations, to help eradicate the abuses, which are part of our society?

These are just some of the questions we can ask ourselves during these six weeks. And, it is never too late to get started, but the earlier we start the better.

Some of the things you might do include:

- Beginning your day with personal prayer.
 You might think of this time as an appointment to meet with the creator of our universe, who wants to meet with you!
- Reading some Scripture, alone or, better still, with others. The Scripture readings for each day in Lent provide excellent material.
- Attending Mass on at least one day during the week.
- Setting aside some money that you might otherwise spend on yourself for a meal, entertainment or clothes and giving it to an organisation which takes care of the less fortunate in our society such as any one of the multiple appeals which are in front of us at this time.

Lent is a grace filled time of our church year. Please make the most of it.
