### Who Cares - Jesus does



Jesus said: 'I am the good shepherd: the good shepherd is one who lays down his life for his sheep. The hired man, since he is not the shepherd and the sheep do not belong to him, abandons the sheep and runs away as soon as he sees a wolf coming and then the wolf attacks and scatters the sheep: this is because he is only a hired man and has no concern for the sheep. 'I am the good shepherd: I know my own and my own know me. just as the Father knows me and I know the Father; and I lay down my life for my sheep. And there are other sheep I have that are not of this fold, and these I have to lead as well. They too will listen to my voice, and there will be only one flock, and one shepherd. 'The Father loves me, because I lay down my life in order to take it up again. No one takes it from me; I lay it down of my own free will, and as it is in my power to lay it down, so it is in my power to take it up again; and this is the command I have been given by my Father.' John 10.11-18

The image of the Good Shepherd is the image of a person who cares. He is not like the other, "who has no concern." He takes the time to get to know

others, and he cares so much that he will even give his life for others. We belong to a church populated by caring individuals who give their lives for others: priests and nuns; missionaries struggling in the remotest parts of the world; peace activists challenging the consciences of nations; people caring lovingly for the sick and dying. What would happen if every single one of us cared, really cared, about our brothers and sisters who are hungry, homeless, helpless, mistreated, victimized, suffering, unemployed, impoverished, threatened, rejected? What would happen if all of us became good shepherds and cared? Wouldn't the consequences be monumental if everyone in the Christian community became a good shepherd?

No one is permitted to disregard the plight of another human being living in dire poverty, enmeshed in ignorance and tormented by insecurity. Pope Paul VI, Populorum Progressio Irish Jesuits
