As you know I spend a considerable amount of time caring for the sick and elderly of our parish. Every now and again a read the introductions to the various sacraments we administer. I recently re-read that for the Pastoral Care of the Sick (PCS). In it I was reminded that we should offer the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick to those who are seriously ill.

There are two complementary aspects of the sacrament:

through the Sacrament the Church supports the sick person in their struggle against illness, and continues Christ's messianic work of healing. *[PCS. n 98]*

Time and again when I celebrate the sacrament I find the person strengthened in faith, more aware of the healing and comforting presence of Christ the Lord and at remarkable peace. This latter is a great help in sickness.

It is important that when a parishioner is diagnosed with a serious illness we are able to bring the sacrament. I hope that we all understand this and do not leave asking until the last moment.

During an illness we strive to bring Holy Communion to the sick person, the strength and hope of christians and the real presence of our Saviour.

When death approaches we offer Viaticum, the last holy Communion. In this the dying person is asked to renew baptismal faith and given the Apostolic Blessing and receives Holy Communion as food for the final journey on earth.

So if you are diagnosed with a serious illness please contact us so that we may offer you the Sacraments of Reconciliation (should you ask) and of Anointing.

Please remember our faithful parishioners who week after week bring Holy Communion to our elderly, sick and homebound brothers and sisters. Theirs is a wonderful task, often hidden and unseen but so important.

And, finally , please keep Father Craig in your prayers while he enjoys his holiday. With my prayers for you all

Bishops urge all Catholics to study Synod's working document Instrumentum laboris

All Catholics are being urged to read the working document that will guide the Synod meeting in Rome in October and help to set the future direction of the Church.

Bishop of Auckland Stephen Lowe, President of the NZ Catholic Bishops Conference, says the Instrumentum laboris (Working Document) published by the Synod Secretariat is another step towards the future, not its final word. "This working document is the product of the process of the Church listening to and hearing what the People of God have said during the parish, diocesan, national and continental stages of the Synod process that Catholics here and around the world have been part of," says Bishop Steve. "It is a document that reflects the Holy Spirit speaking to people throughout the world. As such it is a document for the whole Church, and I invite everyone to prayerfully read and reflect on it, and to pray for the Synod's work over the next 18 months."
