Some years ago I read about a family whose story touched me deeply. A couple had a child. This baby boy had suffered a very difficult birth including being deprived of oxygen during the birth. The result was a beautiful new born baby, except for one thing, he could do nothing himself, including breathe, because of the damage to his brain.

The parents were very young, not in a relationship and could easily have let the child slip away. There was no reason to make the child suffer, but they couldn't do it. They couldn't bring themselves to write off this tiny personality and just get on with their lives. They were struck with love for the tender, vulnerable and beautiful child that had been gifted to them.

They gave him a name, baptised him, rented a machine to help him breathe and then took him home.

During the six months of his life, one of the parents had to remain close enough to him at every moment. They had to work together to care for the child. At the same time, the couple were neither afraid nor burdened by their round the clock care for their son. It was exactly the opposite - they were both very calm and at peace. They were under no illusion, knowing that death was on its way. Despite this knowledge, they continued to love the child.

Over time, their home became a sacred place and everyone who visited, experienced it. People could sense the holiness. It was so palpable, with visitors sensing love emanating from the child. God was truly present in the love between the child and his parents.

The journey we call life can be short and harsh, yet sacred. Love and human life are meant for each other. The Christmas story which we celebrate at this time reinforces this belief. Being born in a cave with no room at the inn, surrounded by animals, star signs and strange visitors messages from the divine. This same strange and wonderful holiness filled the manger and the stable on Christmas night 2000 years ago. Jesus, that tiny soul, filled with love, was born to two young parents, both of whom had said yes to God, with no knowledge of how things would work out.

In our own time, we face struggles, sometimes seemingly overwhelming but with the knowledge that God is Emmanuel - God is with us and that everything is going to be ok even when it's not ok. With everything happening in the dark and dangerous places throughout the world and in the darkness of uncertainty that many people live with here in our own beautiful country, the light of Christ gives us hope and courage and peace and love. We too are in a holy place.

May our good God bless you and all your loved ones this Christmas. In the midst of all the joys and sorrows of life, may you be at peace with everything and everyone in the knowledge that you are loved deeply by our Lord and always will be. Fr Craig


