DO NOT BE AFRAID All through the bible God encourages his people, telling them not to be afraid.

To Abraham, he says: "Do not be afraid, I am your shield." To the prophets, "Do not be afraid, I am with you." To Mary, the angel of the Lord said, "Do not be afraid." To the disciples and the apostles, Jesus said, "Do not be afraid." And to Paul, the Lord said, "Do not be afraid."

Fear is a powerful factor in the life of every human being. In young people and old, fear can express itself as shyness, feelings of inferiority, aggression, and (most painful of all) anxiety. Anxiety is a generalised form of fear: the fear of nothing in particular but of everything in general. It is often about possibilities rather than present realities: the future, possible illness or accident, and death.

When we encounter someone who is afraid, we may say to them: "Don't worry, don't be afraid." These are easy words to say when we are not in the line of fire ourselves and will bring little comfort unless they are backed up by something or someone who can offer practical support.

Today's gospel reading offers a more substantial support. It does not say, "Don't be afraid, it won't happen." It says something like, "Don't be afraid; it may well happen, but when it does happen you will not be destroyed as a person."

The difference is that this is honest and it's real. Surrendering is part of life but it is not necessarily the end. Our Lord gives us the grace and strength to say and do what is right and good, especially when we are facing persecution because of our faith. This persecution may be in the form of ridicule or even physical violence. Whatever it is, God's grace is infinitely more powerful and yes we may lose face (or even worse) but knowing we are not alone and that God is with us, will get us through our troubles and come out the other side. May your troubles be slight this week and may you be aware of our Lord's constant presence. Fr Craig

THE ROBERTS' RAMBLE

I came across this little story:

'On our way to church, we asked our grandchild why it is important to be quiet in church. She said, "Because there are people sleeping"!'

It started a train of thought on the importance of silence. When I was younger, much younger, there were no radios on tractors, or cell phones in our pockets So walking to school or riding a horse around the sheep was done in silence.

I remember one of my parishioners in Stratford telling me how the silence that accompanied much of his work enabled him to spend work time in prayer and thought. I remember too the quiet, thoughtful wisdom of my farming friends fathers.

We know that prayer is important, in fact essential to our daily life. One bishop noted after lengthy thought when asked why he prayed, said, "Because when I don't good things stop happening".

The prophet Elijah hears "the still small voice of God" after the massacre of the prophets of Baal when Queen Jezebel wants to kill him in retribution. *[I Kings 19; 11-13]* We will hear this "still small voice" not only in the readings of Mass but in the silence which follows. Similarly we will hear him in the silence of our hearts when at prayer. And we will be refreshed and ready for his work.

Please don't forget to pray for refugees and exiles, especially, at the request of Caritas, for the Rohingya people of Myanmar (Burma). God keep you safe
