JESUS TAUGHT WITH AUTHORITY

Jesus taught "with authority," that is, he was the author of what he said. Jesus didn't quote other authors, as the scribes used to do. His message had its own inherent authority. What he said went straight to the hearts of those who were open to what he had to say. The only literary device we know he used, was the parable. A parable is not an interpretation of a text, it is a fresh way of looking at ordinary experience. His parables were drawn from the world of agriculture, viticulture, horticulture - in other words, their world. Showing people that their ordinary experience can be an open path To complicate matters, Lent begins very early to God was a totally new concept to the people of Jesus' time. They realised that Jesus was a teacher who understood and respected them, unlike the scribes who used big words and complex ideas to talk about God. The people need is our new Paschal (Easter) Candle were astonished, because his approach was so down to earth.

Jesus' teaching had authority in another sense. What he said, made things happen. (Continued over page) When Jesus told demons to get out, they left. Jesus words and actions set people free. When Jesus spoke, the blind received their sight, the lame were able to walk, lepers were cleansed, the deaf were able to hear, the dead were raised and the poor had good news brought to them. (Luke 7:22). In short, by his actions, Jesus showed that he was indeed the longawaited Messiah. Jesus used the scriptures for their intended purpose, to set people free, not to tie them up as the scribes had done for so long.

Last Sunday was the Word of God Sunday and I spoke about the critical importance of better understanding our sacred scriptures. The following quote from St Jerome highlights this. "To be ignorant of the Scriptures is to be ignorant of Christ,". The reverse of this is equally true: to be ignorant of Christ is to be ignorant of the Scriptures. If we do not read them in the spirit of Christ we are in danger of mis-using them. "If the Son makes you free, you will be free indeed" (John 8:36) Fr Craig and the Irish Jesuits
