Last week, Pope Francis chose Fr John Adams to be our new bishop. This good news has been a long time coming. After waiting for four years, our prayers have been answered. Thank God. Bishop-Elect John will be the third bishop of our diocese. We've had two bishops who've had responsibility for our diocese, Bishop Peter and Bishop Charles. We have also been blessed by the work of Bishop Owen Dolan who, although appointed Coadjutor (with right of succession) was never made the bishop of our diocese because he retired before Bishop Peter. Bishop-Elect John's appointment has been received with joy throughout the diocese and I was heartened by John's own comments:

"I was initially surprised but then joyful to hear, just over a week ago, about the invitation to become the next Catholic Bishop of Palmerston North. Whilst I am saddened that my very happy and fulfilled days in the Diocese of Christchurch will soon come to an end, I have experienced God's providence in my life enough to know that the power of his grace is not limited by location. Surely, we now live in a time that urgently needs to hear the 'good news' of the Gospel. To the people of the Palmerston North diocese, I want to say that my prayers for you have already begun, and I am looking forward to living and sharing with you that same 'good news'.

Please pray for our bishop-elect John, as he comes to terms with the huge responsibility involved in his new role and the ordination itself which looks like it will probably be in September this year. Because of this I will continue in my role for the time being as Local Administrator. Fr Craig

During the week Facebook threw up some quotations from St Jose Maria Escriva. Some I found helpful: "Action is worthless without prayer. Prayer is worth more with sacrifice."

"To reform every day a little; this has to be your constant task if you really want to become a saint." Followed by "Do you really want to be a saint? Carry out each little duty of each moment, do what you ought and concentrate on what you are doing."

It sounds a little like the little Way of St Theresa of Lisieux. It is a counsel of perfection for us in our lives. For most of us it is the way to heaven. therefore to become a saint. Courage is found in the little things of daily life, the services we give each other at home, forgiveness after an argument, accepting forgiveness gracefully; the little extra act for another, thanks offered for the little extra thing done; and so on. A smile and a greeting while on a walk or entering the Church for Mass and such like. It reminds me of the poem by George Herbert, an Anglican country parson and mystic:

Teach me, my God and King, In thee all things to see. To sweep a room as for thy sake, Makes that and the action fine.

His acceptance of the ordinary daily grind of being a country parson brought out the best in his parishioners and led them ever closer to God. It will lead us closer to God and to each other, deepening our love and service for our fellow parishioners. In these little things of daily life we will find ourselves growing in holiness, becoming saints. With my prayers for you all, Father John.
